

Sudoku- keep around a dozen or so of each level in the display.

1. From the site, go to Grids of the Day.
2. Click on Print the Grid. (If the page doesn't load, click on the refresh button until it does.)
3. At the opening screen, hit Print, then choose Properties and go to the Layout tab.
4. Put a check in the Combinations box and select 2 in 1.
5. Print
6. Hit the Back button and print the next level of difficulty. Repeat as needed.
7. Cut each printed page in half- 5 ½"
8. Highlight the level of difficulty and file in the Sudoku display.
 - Easy (green)
 - Medium (yellow)
 - Hard (orange)
 - Evil (pink)

The New York Times Crossword Puzzle- keep at least a dozen in the display.

1. From the link above, choose a puzzle from the topics listed.
2. Click on the topic link
3. From the text in the first paragraph, of the page that opens, click on "In Print" or "Print the Puzzle."
4. On the Print page make sure Page Scaling is set to Shrink to Printable Area and then print.
5. Highlight the topic of the puzzle, fold in half and file in NYT Crossword Display.

Logic Puzzles- Keep around a dozen or so in the display.

1. Hit control P.
2. Click of Preferences.
3. Go to Finishing.
4. Select 2 pages per sheet and portrait OK and Print.
5. Cut in half (5 ½"), staple and file in logic puzzles display.
